

## WHAT TO VISIT IN THE SURROUNDINGS

Agriturismo Il Brugnolo is surrounded by the nature of the Emilian countryside and located in the center of Emilia (between Modena and Reggio Emilia). Farmhouse in the province of Reggio Emilia immersed in unspoiled nature, Il Brugnolo is located in Scandiano, a charming town that has given birth to some important figures in Italian history, including Matteo Maria Boiardo, writer of the poem Orlando Innamorato.

Located in the center of Emilia between Modena and Reggio Emilia, Il Brugnolo is the ideal place for those seeking tranquility without giving up cultural visits to the most beautiful cities of art in the entire region. suggestive city of: Reggio Emilia, just over 10 km away from the structure and where it is possible to admire splendid monuments; Modena, with the Duomo, the Ghirlandina and the Piazza Grande, which have been declared a World Heritage Site by Unesco; and Parma, with the suggestive Baptistry.

From our Agriturismo it is possible to discover the fascinating lands of Matilde di Canossa with churches and castles or to reach the cities of Mantua and Bologna.

Concerts, festivals and parties are held regularly in the surroundings of the farmhouse, all of particular historical and cultural interest. Guests can also immerse themselves in the paradisiacal nature of the Parco del Gigante in the Reggio Apennines or follow interesting trekking routes on the Spallanzani or Matildico path.

For those who love thermal baths, near our farmhouse, there are the Terme di Salvarola, the so-called Divine waters of Emilia Romagna. Instead, for those who love sports, it is possible to visit Maranello and admire the magnificent Ferrari cars. Nearby are also indoor and outdoor swimming pools, tennis courts, athletics center, riding stables and golf courses.

Also nearby are balloon flights and parachute jumps.

Just over 15 km from our farmhouse is Reggio Emilia AV Mediopadana Station, one of the main high-speed stations in Northern Italy, the only intermediate passenger stop on the Milan-Bologna high-speed line. It is one of the most viewed architectural works in Europe, designed by the Spanish architect Santiago Calatrava.
